FEATURED PROJECT

FOSTER FALLS HOTEL RENOVATION - Max Meadows, Virginia

TLG is pleased to provide professional architectural and engineering services to the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR). TLG was commissioned by DCR to provide design services to renovate a historic building located in the remote rural community of Max Meadows, VA. The building had been abandoned for decades before DCR implemented an initial phase of renovation to stabilize and prevent further degradation. The renovated Foster Falls Hotel will contain ten guest suites with private baths, two small banquet rooms and a parlor for receptions and conferences, a serving kitchen for catered events, and an outdoor gathering space for visitors to enjoy the grandeur of the New River setting.

The project consists of a 480 SF addition designed to sensitively meld with the existing exterior detailing, a handicap ramp and brick paver plaza to accommodate accessibility and guest convenience, period focused interior finishes and furnishings throughout, a two-stop hydraulic elevator, complete plumbing, mechanical, and electrical system integration, fire suppression system integration with sprinkler water storage tank, and improvements to the existing package waste water treatment plant to ensure proper performance at peak conditions when large attendance events are hosted.

The project, with a total project cost of \$4.8 Million, is currently under construction and is anticipated to be open to the public in Spring 2021.
