FEATURED PROJECT

SALTVILLE SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT, PHASE 1: TLG is privileged to continue providing professional engineering services to the Town of Saltville, Virginia (Town). TLG was commissioned by the Town to locate sources of infiltration-inflow (I/I) and develop a plan for correction. Methods of I/I discovery included both smoke testing and closed circuit internal video.

The Sewer Improvements Project consists of approximately 2,000 linear feet of 6-inch gravity sewerline replacement, approximately 500 LF of sewer re-lining (CIPP - Cured in place pipe), replacement of 19 sewer manholes, six pump station improvements and other areas of localized improvements based on I/I discovery.

The project is currently under construction and has a total project cost is \$603,830 with funding assistance from the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (VDEQ).
